




- All sheep inventory is up 7.1% from last year, and increased 21% since 2021.
- Market lambs inventory is at a record high level of 19,000.
- Breeding sheep and lamb inventory rose 5.7% from 2023, with the biggest increase from 2,000 more replacement lambs.
- Kentucky ranks 23rd nationally for sheep inventory




- Meat goat inventory increased 5.4% from last year, the highest level since 2016.
